BOARD MEETING

FEBRUARY 10, 2015

Supervisor Glor called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Attorney Kevin Earl reviewed the Town & Village Water Agreement with the Board. Attorney Earl asked the question to the Town Board "if the Village doesn't break out the rates as instructed in the proposed agreement, how do they come up with a rate?" The Board could not answer that question.

Paragraph of the proposed agreement will be amended.

Paragraph 15 & 16—The Village must tell the Town by August of any delinquent water users that may be scheduled to have their water bills relevied to the Town & County tax bill. The final list of delinquent water users would have to be given to the town by November 1 of each year to be put on the tax bills.

At 7:30 Mayor Jason Armbrewster joined the meeting.

Paragraph 25—this paragraph will also be revised as the Town does not collect money from water; therefore the 25% for hydrant flushing should come from O&M.

Attorney Earl stated that he will have a redline version of this agreement within the week.

Mayor Armbrewster presented the Fire Protection Agreement.

Mayor Armbrewster stated that the Fire Department is requesting that money from last year's budget that was not spent on maintenance be returned to this year's budget. After a lengthy discussion and review of prior Town Board minutes it was left that a meeting with the Fire Department will be held on February 23, 2015 at 5 pm at the Fire Hall.

Mayor Armbrewster stated that snow removal at the intersections in the Village is being addressed.

The Village has received a water violation form the Health Department for the third & fourth quarter of 2014. The Village must send out a "boiler plate" letter from the Health Department by law to all water

users. Mayor Armbrewster stated that some new sampling areas are in discussion with the Health Department.

Public Works Supervisor Dennis stated that hydrant flushing and a change in operation and maintenance must occur. This is a system issue and not just in the Village of Oakfield.

JUSTICE

Justice Graham stated that through the JCAP Grant he applied for the Town will receive \$30,000 to be used on the building construction. This money must be spent within 180 days.

The Justice Office will move into the Clerk's office sometime in March to prepare for the building renovation. Records need to be moved to accommodate this transition. Justice Graham has priced a 20' storage unit at \$75.00 per month with a \$120 haul in, haul out through Alverti. **MOTION** Councilman Kabel, second Councilman Martin to rent the storage unit.

SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS

ROAD WORK—scheduling fixing road side ditch on Hutton Road by USG Pond (4 foot pipe wash out) plan on using 2 ft. x 2 ft. x 6 ft. Concrete solid blocks.

Bridges on Hutton Road and Maple Road will be replaced next year by County Highway.

Plowing and treating roads as needed; this has been a winter that is normal but the people are not used to a normal winter.

Working with the Village on snow issues.

BUILDINGS & GROUNDS

Working on our building expansion review plan drawing and evaluation drawaings.

Banning building expansion needed ASAP.

Need to keep working with our engineers on building design moving forward. February 16, 2015 project is going to bid and bid opening is March 16, 2015.

Purchase for building expansion \$5500.00/acre plus all closing costs with a permanent access to the field behind the town building. Kevin Earl completing now.

Contacted USG Co. to request if they could help us out with material for the building addition, wall board, metal studs and ceiling tile. Jim Perry said he would be glad to support this and pass it on to Chicago.

CEMETERIES

Been active with burials.

Winter digging is a challenge and looking at equipment to handle the winter conditions.

PARKS

Are being used and keeping parking lots plowed as our schedules allow.

We are keeping trash cans emptied.

We are looking at some upgrades to the park with our Engineers so we can apply for grants as they become available. We will talk to Little League and the Betterment Committee for financial assistance along with the Job Corps to possibly do the work.

RESOLUTION NO. 10-GREEN GENESEE/SMART GENESEE PROJECT INTERMUNICIPAL AGREEMENT

Councilman Kabel offered the following:

GREEN GENESEE/SMART GENESEE PROJECT INTERMUNICIPAL AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made the _____ day of _____, 20____, by and among the **TOWN OF ALABAMA**, a municipal corporation in the State of New York, with office located at 2218 Judge Road, Oakfield, New York 14125, (hereinafter "Alabama"); and the TOWN OF BATAVIA, a municipal corporation in the State of New York, with offices located at 3833 West Main Street Road, Batavia, New York 14020, (hereinafter "Batavia"); and the TOWN OF OAKFIELD, a municipal corporation in the State of New York, with offices located at 3219 Drake Street, Oakfield, New York 14125, (hereinafter "Oakfield"); and the VILLAGE OF OAKFIELD, a municipal corporation in the State of New York, with offices located at 37 Main Street, Oakfield, New York 14125, (hereinafter "Village"); and NEW YORK **GREEN**, INC., a not-for-profit corporation with offices located at 99 MedTech Drive, Batavia, New York 14020, (hereinafter "NYG"); and the COUNTY OF GENESEE, a municipal corporation in the State of New York, with offices located at 15 Main Street, Batavia, New York (hereinafter "County"); COUNTY **INDUSTRIAL** 14020. and the GENESEE DEVEOPMENT AGENCY, d/b/a GENESEE COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CENTER, a public benefit corporation of the State of New York, with offices located at 99 MedTech Drive, Batavia, New York 14020, (hereinafter "GCEDC"); and GENESEE GATEWAY LOCAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION, a 501(c) not-for-profit corporation of the State of New York, with offices located at 99 MedTech Drive, Batavia, New York 14020; collectively referred to herein as the "Parties".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Batavia, on behalf of all the Parties, applied for and has obtained from the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority, (hereinafter "NYSERDA"), a grant in the amount of \$175,000.00 for the Green Genesee/Smart Genesee Project, (hereinafter "Project"), and

WHEREAS, on September 18, 2014, Batavia entered into Agreement Number 39518 to provide the services as set forth therein to complete the Green Genesee Road Map and Municipal Green Action Plans in furtherance of the overall Project, (hereinafter "NYSERDA Agreement"), and

WHEREAS, the total cost set forth in the NYSERDA Agreement was the sum of \$308,344.00, to be paid with the aforesaid grant of \$175,000.00, plus cash and in-kind services provided by the Parties herein, totaling \$133,334.00, and

WHEREAS, on May 22, 2014, Batavia, on behalf of all of the Parties, entered into an Agreement with Conservation Connects, to act as the Contractor to provide services for the first phase of the Project, for the sum of \$242,500.00, to be paid with the aforesaid NYSERDA grant of \$175,000.00, plus the \$67,500.00 in cash to be contributed by the Parties, (hereinafter "Contractor Agreement").

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, it is agreed as follows:

1. The Parties, other than Batavia, do hereby ratify and adopt the terms and conditions of the NYSERDA Agreement, a copy of which is annexed hereto and made a part hereof as **EXHIBIT A**, and confirm that Batavia was authorized to enter into this Agreement on behalf of all of the Parties in furtherance of the Project.

2. The Parties do hereby ratify and adopt the terms and conditions of the Contractor Agreement, a copy of which is annexed hereto and made a part hereof as **EXHIBIT B**, and confirm that Batavia was authorized to enter into this Agreement on behalf of all of the Parties in furtherance of the Project.

3. Each Party will contribute cash and in-kind services in the amounts set forth in the Contributions Table, annexed hereto and made a part hereof as <u>**EXHIBIT**</u> <u>**C**</u>.

4. The cash contributions of each Party shall be paid to the Town of Batavia within thirty (30) days of the date that the final Party executes this Agreement.

5. Batavia, on behalf of all of the Parties, shall make the cash payments as required in the Contractor Agreement.

6. Batavia, on behalf of all of the Parties, will monitor and manage the performance of Conservation Connects with regard to the Contractor Agreement.

7. Batavia, on behalf of the Parties, will be responsible to perform all of the tasks set forth in the Statement of Work of the NYSERDA Agreement and shall manage and monitor the same on behalf of the Parties.

8. Batavia will arrange for and monitor the deployment of in-kind services, as required in **EXHIBIT** C herein.

9. Batavia will provide to the other Parties periodic Project status updates, and will provide any information and documentation to any individual Party upon request.

10. In consideration for the contributions made by the parties as set forth in Exhibit C herein, the parties shall receive the deliverables as specified within the NYSERDA Agreement.

11. This Agreement may not be assigned by any of the Parties in whole or in part, without the prior written consent of all of the other Parties.

12. This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of all of the Parties hereto, and their heirs, successors and permitted assigns.

13. If any provision of this Agreement shall be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, the validity, legality or enforceability of the remainder of this Agreement shall not be effected or impaired thereby.

14. This Agreement and any transactions between all of the Parties hereunder shall be governed by, construed and interpreted in accordance with the Laws of the State of New York.

15. There are no other Agreements or understanding, either oral or written, between the Parties affecting this Agreement.

16. No changes or additions or deletions of any portions of this Agreement shall be valid or binding upon the Parties hereto, unless the same is approved in writing by all of the Parties.
