Supervisor Glor called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm; followed by the Pledge to the Flag.

OAKFIELD BETTERMENT COMMITTEE

Joel D'Alba thanked Supervisor Glor and Superintendent of Highways Dennis for attending the January 20th meeting with the Village.

The Betterment Committee is working on permits to close the roads and will follow up to see if it works out.

Mr. D'Alba read a letter aloud, said letter is attached to these minutes.

Supervisor Glor asked Mr. D'Alba if they had gotten any prices on renting of road signs as of yet.

Mr. D'Alba stated that he knows there will be a cost to Betterment, they do not have cost estimates yet. The Betterment Committee would also like to use the Town Park in addition to Triangle Park.

Mr. D'Alba asked if Betterment can use the Town items such as bleachers.

Superintendent Dennis stated that this event is never going to be what is was. The Village cannot apply for the Perm 33c permit without the Town. The State will not take responsibility for anything. This leave the Town Highway Superintendent to assume all responsibility. That is a huge liability to the Town if anything goes wrong.

As far as costs are concerned, Superintendent Dennis has spoken to Clark Patterson regarding the design of the detours. Everything that goes in the roads and signs must meet state codes. Genesee County Highway Department will make the signs; the Town must supply the man power, posts and hardware.

The Village, Town and OBC can work together but there is a lot of work that falls on the Town. Such as dig safe for every location. Superintendent Dennis stated that just to put the signs up will take a week. The Town can do it but it is very time consuming.

Mr. D'Alba asked if the Town would approve a resolution stating that they would help and support the Betterment Committee in bringing the event back to Triangle Park.

Supervisor Glor stated that the Town will need the engineers to get us a quote on all aspects of cost associated with what is needed. The Town cannot tell you what we can commit to until we get all the information.

Scott D'Alba said that this is why we pay taxes. The Town spent two days putting up Christmas trees, what's the difference?

Superintendent Dennis stated that he is wrestling with the liability of all of this.

Joel D'Alba stated that you can't always worry about the liability, we would never do anything.

The Town & Village is also waiting on insurance quotes for the event.

Superintendent Dennis stated that we are not against the event, we just need to see what all the costs are and what is entailed.

- 1) Road Work Update
 - a) Winter time plowing and treating roads.
 - b) Using a lot of salt and fuel due to severe winter weather especially salt by the town, village, and school.
- 2) Building & Grounds
 - a) Waiting for suggestions on stone cracking and prevention of further damage.
- 3) Cemeteries
 - a) Been slow due to weather.
 - b) Getting est. for a cremation mausoleum.
 - c) Trees at Cary Cemetery and re-plant with decorative trees and get stumps ground. This work has started three trees done and more will be completed this year based on the weather.
 - d) Planning on paving main driveways this year. Where will funds come from to pay for?
 - e) Fence removal at Reed Cemetery will be done as weather permitting.

Parks

- a) We are looking at some up-grades to park with our Engineers so we can apply for grants as they become available and talk to little league, betterment committee for financial assistance. We may want to consider doing this work and possibly banning it. The drawings are revised now. The cost est. is by Clark-Patterson.
- b) We need to discuss next steps in the park up-grades.
- c) Will be installing memorial bench at the tee ball field permanently in concrete pad which is all poured.
- 4) Equipment Update
 - a) Truck 202 is down at J & M for repair possible injector problem.
 - b) New 908 loader has been delivered.
- 5) Publics Works Update
 - a) WD 7 SERGI needs to come back to do some touch-up restoration.

- b) WD 9 & 3 construction complete by Ransco. This is MaCumber Road south of Town-line and Town-line in the town of Alabama. House hook-ups are almost complete. Ransco has been back to complete touch-up restoration.
- c) WD 10 package has been submitted to RD waiting for final approval to go to bid.
- d) WD 11 Judge Road, MaCumber Road going well contractor will be starting back to work Monday January 15, 2018,
- e) Clark Patterson has started laying out sewer districts for future expansion and current needs in the town, also creating a sewer district where there is already sewer in the town. Village will be at all future meetings on sewer, Eric Carlson will be DPW contact person and Dave Boyle is the Village Board contact.
- f) Working on a Genesee County North West Water/Sewer Consortium. Made up of all The towns and villages in the North West corner of Genesee County. This will handle all the O and M of all the water and sewer in that area. Monroe Water Authority in future is the way to go.
- g) Need to pursue getting together with village with Town Board, Town Attorney, County Attorney, County Highway Superintendent, Village Board, and Village Attorney on water debt distribution.
- 6) Library
 - a) Everything seems good.
- 7) Miscellaneous
- a) Need to set up meeting on possible housing development plan areas for Town of Oakfield a developer has already been here for info on locations for housing tracts.
 - b) Land fill will open for the whole year weather permitting access.
 - c) We need to look at all our codes and STDs. And be prepared for the future that looks very promising. Stamp is alive and moving forward at a good pace and we need to be prepared.
 - d) Need to revise and up-date our zoning codes.
 - e) Working with a solar company on a solar field installation. Nothing new to report.

- f) Town Highway and Alabama highway has completed Building road-way, pad, and utility trench for OACS FFA barn.
- h) Need to revise and up-date our zoning codes.

RESOLUTION NO. 4-2018—AUTHORIZING PARTIAL ACCEPTANCE OF FACILITIES

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PARTIAL ACCEPTANCE OF FACILITIES

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Oakfield (the "Town Board"), acting for and on behalf of Water District No. 11 of said Town, in cooperation with the Genesee County Economic Development Center (the "GCEDC") to construct the facilities known as STAMP Offsite Water Main - Phase 1 (the "Project") and

WHEREAS, certain property owners within Water District No. 11 have requested that the Town accept at this time a portion of the facilities of STAMP Offsite Water Main - Phase 1 to permit water service to certain properties therein, and

WHEREAS, David Drexel, Resident Engineer regarding said construction has supervised the construction of said facilities and has certified to the Clark Patterson Lee (the "Engineer") that the water lines have been properly tested and meet the contract specifications for such lines, and

WHEREAS, the Town's Engineer indicates that this is a separately functioning and usable part of the Project that can be used by the Town for its intended purpose without significant interference with the remainder of the Project, and

WHEREAS, the Engineer finds it in the best interest of the Town at this time to use certain completed portions of the work, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF OAKFIELD, in regular session duly convened that said Board, acting for and on behalf of Water District No. 11 of said Town, hereby accepts the water lines serving Judge Road from Lewiston to Macomber, reserving, however, all rights that the Town may have against the said GCEDC pending final completion and acceptance of all the facilities to be constructed for the said Water District No. 11.

The use of the completed portions of STAMP Offsite Water Main - Phase 1 and the taking of possession thereof shall not be deemed an acceptance of any other portions of the water facilities being constructed nor any uncompleted portions thereof nor of any work not completed in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor previously approved by the Town.
